Ms. Meredith Peterson, Chairperson of the Local Task Force on the Right to Education (LTF #3) called the meeting to order at 6:35 PM on November 2, 2022.

# IV. Guest Speaker – Mrs. Mary Evrard – Allegheny County ODS (Office of Developmental Services)

Mrs. Evrard explained the Office of Developmental Services and what services they provide for children at this time.

Mrs. Evrard also explained the ODS Assessment and Resource Team and they services they provide for the public including:

- Supports Coordinator

#### V. Consumer Concerns

A concern brought up regarding a student being bullied on social media and at school and the parents have contacted the school district for assistance in this matter. The school district has offered the family no assistance at this time and the family was wondering where they could get assistance for this issue. Several members of the LTF suggested that the parent check into the bullying policy of their child's school district and also contact the Pennsylvania Safe to Say program.

A parent was looking for early intervention services in the City of Pittsburgh and was told to contact their Early Intervention Office at 412-529-4000.

A concern was brought up regarding group services being offered for Early Reach OVR instead of individualized services. OVR stated that their Early Reach program service are individualized at this time. Several members of the LTF suggested that the parent put that the child should receive individualized OVR services in their IEP.

A parent brought up a concern regarding her son receiving alternative transportation to his school. Parent is worried that the school district will take the alternative transportation away from her son. Several members of the LTF suggested that the parent put that her son must receive alternative transportation in his IEP and the school district can't take this away from him. There may be some issues if they can't find a driver or an aide to provide the alternative transportation but the district should communicate any issues with the parent.

If students are at higher risk of hospitalization and or death from COVID, that IEP or 504-plan team needs to ensure that they are able to receive FAPE safely. In addition, schools are obligated to make necessary modifications/accommodations to do that without segregating students with disabilities. One option might be, on a case-by-case basis, expecting others who interact with them to wear masks. Another might be to have smaller groups of nondisabled peers for instruction so they can be included in at atmosphere with fewer risks.
