- Specially designed programs and events
- Community and human service system resources
- Information from the PA Office of Developmental Programs (ODP)
- New and updated FactSheets as developed by OID
- Resources and programs from AC DHS and DHS Offices
- Special education information
- · Workshops, meetings and conferences

The Allegheny County Office of Intellectual Disability (OID) assists eligible children, graduating students and adults. This includes sharing helpful resources and connection to a Supports Coordinator (SC).

Those eligible to register with OID and access Supports Coordination services include

- ⇒ individuals with autism
- ⇒ individuals with intellectual disability
- ⇒ children with developmental delays

Everyone must meet all PA Department of Humans Services Office of Developmental Programs (ODP) established criteria.

You will be guided through the registration process by our Assessment and Resource Team. After OID verifies eligibility we will meet with you. There, we will complete required documents and share supports coordination organization choices. We can also assist you to navigate helpful community supports.

Your SC will learn what life experiences are important to you and your family and assist with creating a person centered Individual Support Plan (ISP). This may include ideas for you to

- ⇒ engage in a more meaningful life
- ⇒ be well supported in your home
- ⇒ fully access and participate in your community
 - ⇒ remain healthy and safe
 - ⇒ find and keep a job you like
 - ⇒ enjoy desired activities
 - ⇒ learn new things
 - ⇒ successfully transition to adulthood
 - ⇒ provide a break for a caregiver
